The paper must be based on sound legal research, double-spaced, and conform to the legal citation rules recognized and adopted by the Law School. Typically, the one credit class is approximately 15 pages in length, while the two credit version is approximately 30. Moreover, on specified dates, the following are due to the faculty member: (1) the topic and length of the paper, (2) an outline of the paper, and (3) one or more drafts of the paper. A separate grade sheet will be provided for the grade. The Law School does not offer additional compensation to any faculty member agreeing to supervise a paper.
